WORD OF THE WEEK
This week our word is 'remnant' - a 'remnant' is something that remains or is left over. It 1st appeared in the 14th and 15th century. It can be traced to the Anglo-French remanant, and is from the present participle of remaindre 'to remain.'
'remnant' is a noun e.g. There was a remnant of cloth left at the market. The child had fell over and there was a remnant of blood left on their knee.
Synonyms include: left overs, remains, remainder, odds and ends, bit, *Please ask your child about the word 'remnant' and encourage them to use this word in their every day talking and their homework.*
